SANDRA MUKEYA Young radio journalist

Sandra Mukeya, 18, lives in Likasi, a city in the south of the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). Passionate about journalism, she has just finished high school and will soon begin her studies at the University of Lumbabashi in communications and information science.

"I only have one wish: to become a great political journalist. I really like to express myself. My opinion is important and has value. Journalism has taught me what needs to be said and how to say it. You have to tell the truth but you need to elaborate. Radio has had a positive impact on society here. Before, there was no television and no radio, so it was impossible to be aware of what was going on in the community."

For more than a decade, Development and Peace has been supporting community radio stations in six provinces of the DRC, a country affected by more than two decades of conflict. From the start, these radio networks have, among other things, encouraged widespread and peaceful participation in elections, improved education for girls, increased social cohesion and expanded agricultural production.
